2017 USS Nimitz Association History

The USS Nimitz (CVN-68) Association held our 20th Reunion in Norfolk Virginia from September 13th through September 16th 2017. Our Host and Hostess were Rob and DeeDee Jamison. The first night at the hotel, the Blue Angels did a fly over, what a rousing way to start a Reunion.

Wednesday, 13 September 2017: The Bud Scott Hospitality Room was open to all hands and guests. President Wood commenced Executive/Full Board meeting to discuss the Agenda for Thursday's All Hands and Membership Business meeting.

Thursday, 14 September 2017

President Wood opened All Hands meeting and welcomed members, spouses and guests. Introductions were conducted and first time attendees were recognized. We had 97 members and guests attending. After dinner, Rob and DeeDee Jamison were thanked for hosting and coordinating the 20th Annual Reunion. Dottie Wilder (Spousal Advocate) presented DeeDee Jamison with a bouquet of flowers.

Captain Lennox (Commanding Officer USS Nimitz) provide the Association with an update video. As the banquet ended, Father Peter Norris conducted the Benediction.
